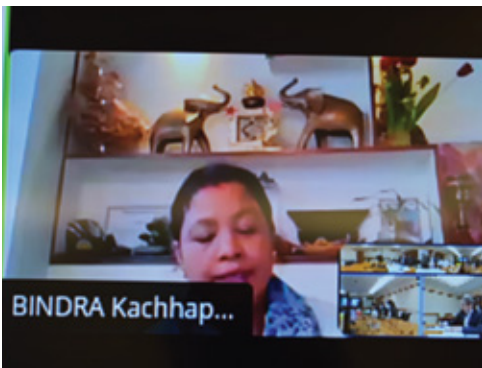

TAPPING INTO NEPAL'S GROWTH



KUALA LUMPUR (23 SEPTEMBER 2020): Malaysia will have much to gain from Nepal's construction industry which is set to boom with the building of new resorts and international hotels, parliament house, Prime Minister's residence and other government buildings.
